






The main objective of the project FRUMOSS (Human Resources Development, Mediation, Orientation and Social Services) is reducing the risk of poverty and social exclusion by introducing integrated measures to address the access to education, health, employment and housing. The main focus of the activities is around education and employment, which represent the most pressing issues vulnerable Roma are faced with in Targu Frumos.







What is ROMACT T.C.C.?






