


OBJECTIVES

ROMACT is a process that takes between eighteen to twenty-two months in each municipality.

It is designed to assist local authorities in improving the lives of all citizens, including Roma, by collaboratively assessing needs, planning actions alongside all relevant stakeholders, and facilitating implementation of these plans through capacity building and concrete measures.

Since 2022, ROMACT reinforced process began to be implemented in former localities upon request, to enhance capacities and provide support to previously established structures through the Programme.

3 Pilot Municipalities

After identifying the relevant and willing municipalities, a network of experts organized around a coordinator was formed and trained on the ROMACT methodology to provide support for municipalities, capacity development, training and guidance to prepare project proposals and implement inclusive policies to improve the living conditions and social integration of vulnerable populations, including the Roma. Local councils in municipalities have agreed to join the process and letter of engagements' signatures are imminent.





EVIDENCE-BASED GUIDANCE

ROMACT produces reports, guides and studies, based on the evidence from the ground, to support local, national, and European stakeholders in policy design and adaptation



Guide on Social Housing Allocation Criteria

The Guide is based on needs assessments in ROMACT municipalities in Romania. It supports local authorities in better understanding of the social housing allocation methodology.

It combines legal and social approaches and exemplifies potential restrictive criteria and criteria that are accessible and already used by some municipalities to prevent discriminatory allocation practices.





Study on "children left behind"

This ROMACT study identifies the challenges faced by children left behind, by parents going abroad for work, in selected municipalities in Bulgaria.

The report includes several specific recommendations directed at various stakeholders (parents, quardians, relevant institutions) with the goal of minimizing the consequences for the children left behind.

EVIDENCE-BASED GUIDANCE



Guide & awareness raising campaign on the protection of children with parents going to work abroad

Thousands of children are left behind in Romania and Bulgaria as their parents move abroad for work. This puts at risk the fundamental rights of these children, such as the right to family and protection, education, leisure, right to play, right to opinion and participation.

The Guide supports local authorities in fulfilling their responsibilities regarding the protection of children whose parents moved abroad to work and includes the list of steps to be followed when it comes to public sector action.







Toolkit: Possible solutions for informal settlements

The Toolkit is dedicated to local public authorities in Romania who wish to start a process of legalizing informal settlements and design development projects together with the community.

It lists all the necessary steps and tools to accomplish them: analysis of the informal settlements, demarche of legalization and local development planning.
